### Ciele:

VV1 Študent si prehľbuje získané literárnohistorické a kultúrohistorické poznatky v priamom kontakte s anglofónnymi kultúrami.

VV2 Študent získava priamu skúsenosť so zážitkovým a objavným učením.

VV3 Študent dokáže efektívne prezentovať vlastné skúsenosti s anglofónnou kultúrou.

VV4 Študent si rozvíja literárne a kultúrne povedomie a tvorivosť.

VV5 Študent si rozvíja tvorivosť s využitím pokročilých digitálnych zručností (tvorba videofilmu).

### Organizačné poznámky

1. Exkurziu môže študent absolvovať organizovane pod vedením vyučujúceho (ak takú možnosť katedra zorganizuje) alebo samostatne (nezávisle od vyučujúceho).
2. V prípade, že ide študent samostatne, je potrebné, aby ešte pred odchodom konzultoval svoj program a náplň budúceho videofilmu s vyučujúcim.
3. Exkurziu môže študent absolvovať v ktorejkoľvek anglofónnej krajine alebo v krajine so silnou prítomnosťou anglofónnej kultúry (napr. v Paríži, Ríme, Viedni a Florencii môže navštíviť mnohé miesta spojené s pobytmi slávnych anglofónnych umelcov, v Amsterdame a Leidne zase mnohé miesta spojené s puritánmi a ich odchodom do Ameriky, kde založili prvé anglofónne kolónie).
4. Príklady náplní exkurzií pre vybrané krajiny a mestá nájde študent na webe KAJL v sekcii Študijné informácie/exkurzie.
5. Cestu, ubytovanie a poistenie si zabezpečuje študent sám. Odporúčame cestovať v skupine.
6. Každá exkurzia zahŕňa povinnú a nepovinnú časť.
7. Povinnú časť exkurzie tvoria návštevy literárnych múzeí a iných pamätihodností spojených s anglofónnou literatúrou danej krajiny, návštevy umeleckých galérií a návšteva kultúrnych a architektonických pamiatok UNESCO, ako aj zážitky, napr. ochutnávka typických jedál a nápojov, skúšky tradičných odevov a pod.
8. Nepovinná časť exkurzie zahŕňa akékoľvek aktivity, ktoré doplnia a spestria nielen pobyt, ale aj výsledný videofilm, ako napr. zacytenie rôznych kuriozít a zaujímavostí.
9. Výsledný videofilm študent nahrá do stanoveného termínu (spravidla koniec semestra) pre potreby archivácie do Moodle.

### Výsledky vzdelávania:

Predmet integruje zážitkové vyučovanie, komunikačné jazykové zručnosti v cudzom jazyku a digitálno-prezenčné zručnosti. Študenti prostredníctvom návštevy konkrétnych kultúrnych a historicky významných miest v anglicky hovoriacich krajinách získajú vedomosti, zručnosti a návyky potrebné pre efektívnu prácu učiteľa anglického jazyka alebo kultúrneho pracovníka pre medzinárodné kontakty s anglofónnymi krajinami a kultúrami.

### Hodnotenie:

Každý predmet je ukončený vypracovaním multimediálneho projektu (videofilm) o navštívených kultúrnych a historicky významných miestach. Multimediálny projekt v trvaní **minimálne 7 min.** môže študent vytvoriť individuálne alebo v skupine.

Aby bol výsledný projekt multimediálny, musí zahŕňať:

- obrazovú zložku (fotky, videá, animácie)
- verbálnu zložku (texty, napr. popisy fotografií)
- zvukovú zložku (slovný komentár študenta/študentov a hudobný podmaz).

Každá zložka projektu (obrazová, verbálna a zvuková) ako aj jeho atraktivnosť, originalita, informačná pestrosť materiálu a jazyková korektnosť sa hodnotí samostatne.

## Príklady programovej náplne exkurzie /obsahu videofilmu

### London

#### Roman London

- 1) **Not much has been left from the Roman city Londinium (AD 43). *The Roman ruins may be seen on the Tower Hill. Visit them and take your picture there.***
- 2) **Find the *Emperor Trajan statue* in the Tower Hill Gardens and take your picture with it.**

#### Anglo-Saxon London

- 3) In the 6th century, Anglo-Saxons settled just west and upriver of Londonium. They established their own city of **Lundenwic where *Covent Garden, Charing Cross and the Strand*** are today. These days, one of the best world universities - ***the King's College*** - resides here. Visit the place and take your picture there. How many people from the King's College and its associated institutions have been awarded the Nobel Prize?
- 4) ***The Savoy*** (Strand) was the first luxury hotel in Britain. Winston Churchill often took his cabinet to lunch at the hotel. Who were hotel's famous visitors? What was the room price for a night at the time of your stay in London? (At 216 Strand, you may want to visit ***Twinings' 300-year-old tea shop***).
- 5) In AD 597 Christian missionaries arrived at London and in 604 AD a cathedral was founded in London and named after the apostle, ***Saint Paul***. There is still a cathedral on the site. Visit the place and take your pictures there. In your project, explain its brief history.
- 6) The last Saxon King, Edward the Confessor (1042-1066) built a wooden palace at Westminster, close to his new abbey, where all kings and queens of England have been crowned ever since. Who were the last king and queen crowned there? Visit the place and take your pictures there. In your project, introduce a brief history of both ***Westminster Abbey and Westminster Cathedral***.

#### Norman London

- 7) William, Duke of Normandy, was crowned king at Westminster Abbey on 25 December 1066. He built three military camps on London, one eventually became known as the ***Tower of London***. Visit the place and take your pictures there. In your project, introduce some interesting facts about the place. I will especially value the pictures taken with ***the Beefeaters*** and the ***Crows of the Tower***.
- 8) Find an architectural curiosity - a ***Norman archway*** carrying a Tudor gatehouse (the gate to the Priory Church of St Bartholomew the Great). Explain its history.

#### From Medieval London to the 18th century

- 9) **On the ruins of the Roman amphitheatre, *the Guildhall*** was built first in 1128 and then in 1411. What was its original purpose and what is its purpose today?
- 10) Go to see ***the Monument to the Great Fire*** of London. Explain the story it commemorates.
- 11) The Guildhouse was the centre of slave trade, too. In 1783, the Zong Case was heard here. Explain the case briefly. Visit ***the Gilt of Cain*** monument (Fenchurch Street, Fen Court).
- 12) One of the oldest palaces in London is ***St James***. What remarkable people lived there and what important events happened there? Take your picture in front of the great gatehouse with sentries.
- 13) **King Henry VIII built many other palaces, too, such as the Palace of Whitehall. What is now in its place?** Take a walk from the Trafalgar Square to the Parliament Square. Can you find any remains of the Tudor times there?
- 14) In 1599, ***the Globe theatre*** was opened. What did it (its copy, of course) play at the time of your visit?
- 15) Find ***the Golden Hinde***. Take your photo in front of it. Explain its history.
- 16) Take your picture in front of ***Oliver Cromwell statue*** near the Parliament Square.
- 17) Since 1735, ***the Prime Minister's office*** has a permanent address. What is the address? Find it and take your picture in front of the fence.
- 18) Go see at least two of these famous Royal buildings/places established in the era: Buckingham Palace, Kensington Palace, Covent Garden and the Royal Opera House, St. James's Park, Hyde Park.

#### Victorian London

- 19) Take your picture with ***the Houses of Parliament*** from the ***Westminster Bridge***. Explain its history briefly.
- 20) Cross ***the Thames*** over ***the Tower Bridge***. Take pictures of yourself and passing boats/ships.
- 21) Whose column can we see at ***the Trafalgar Square***? What is his story?
- 22) The world first underground railway (***The Tube***) opened in 1862. How many stations did it have at the time of your visit? Take your photo at the station you used during your stay in London and which is furthest (the highest number of stations away) from the Oxford Circus Station.

- 23) Pay visit to *Charles Dickens* thanks to whom we know so much about Victorian London (48 Doughty Street, the London home of Charles Dickens). Visit *The Old Curiosity Shop* (13-14 Portsmouth Street), too.

### War London

- 24) Take your picture with *the Cenotaph*. What is it?  
25) Find *Winston Churchill's* house (28 Hyde Park Gate, Kensington) *and statue* (the Parliament Square). You may want to visit *Churchill's War rooms*, too (Clive Steps, King Charles Street).  
26) Go to see *the HMS Belfast*. Take your picture with it.

### Modern London

- 27) *The Piccadilly Circus* was built in the Victorian Era. These days, it is the symbol of modern London. Visit the place and take your picture with the light advertisements in the background.  
28) Visit *Candem* and take your picture with the Amy Winehouse Statue at Candem Market (407 Chalk Farm Rd). You may also want to visit the nearby *Primrose Hill*, London home to many Hollywood stars, musicians and politicians (Chalcot Crescent & Chalcot Square).  
29) Visit *the Leicester Square* and take your picture with your favourite movie star (or gadget).  
30) Go to see some or all *Millennium structures* (the London Eye, the Millenium Dome, the Millenium Bridge). Why is the last one called the Wobbly Wobbly Bridge?  
31) Take your picture on *the London Bridge* with *the modern London skyline* in the background (in your commentary, briefly explain the London Bridge's history and name some famous skyscrapers in the picture).  
32) Modern London is famous for its *street food*. Eat something unusual and show the world proudly 😊

### Optional - Dark and hidden sides of London

- 33) Visit *the Cross Bones Graveyard* (corner of the Union St & Red Cross Way, Southwark) where 1,500 paupers and prostitutes (half of them children) were buried unceremoniously.  
34) In the central London, there were numerous plague pits, these days hidden and built over. Visit the *Christchurch Garden* (Victoria St), one of the 1666 plague pits. In the garden, you will also find *Henry Purcell statue*. Why was he called *Orfeus Britannicus*?  
35) Visit *the Charterhouse Square* (Barbican), the largest mass grave of Black death victims where 50,000 people rest.  
36) *SIS Building* (the Vauxhall Cross) starred in many James Bond movies and is the actual home of the Secret Intelligence Service (MI6). Find it and take your picture in front of it (Please, do not try to enter. We want you back alive).  
37) Visit one of *the Murder Sites of Jack the Ripper* (you can find its complete list [here](#)).

### Important notes:

- 1) Only first 32 tasks are compulsory.
- 2) The list of the tasks is organized chronologically. I recommend you plan your visit on the map first. You will see that the places to be visited are very close to each other and sometimes more tasks can be fulfilled at once visiting just one place.
- 3) You may add anything else and make your project unique.
- 4) Please, do not miss the opportunity to visit the British Museum and the National Gallery.

## Edinburgh

1. A picture of you wearing Scottish tartan
2. A picture of you having a typical Scottish afternoon tea (ideally in the Signet Library whose afternoon tea has the royal stamp of approval)
3. A picture of you (really) eating some Scottish typical food (e.g. haggis) - enjoying it is not necessary :)
4. Your selfie from the Arthur's Seat
5. The best possible shot of you and the Edinburgh Castle
6. A picture of you with something related to Mary, Queen of Scots, who lived in the Hollyrood Palace
7. Pictures from your visit to the Writers' Museum.
8. A picture of you in front of the grave of "real" Tom Riddle in Greyfriars Kirkyard
9. A picture of you visiting and having coffee/tea in the cafés and the hotel where J.K. Rowling wrote her books about Harry Potter
10. Pictures of you in the Grassmarket with the execution spot and the White Hart Inn - probably the oldest pub in Edinburgh

11. A picture of you being at the National Monument Hill with the Nelson's Monument, Dugald Stewart Monument, and the Old Royal High School at the Calton Hill
12. A picture of you in the Medieval Manhattan" in the Gladstone's Land
13. Five pictures of five Edinburgh dogs (Greyfriars Bobby, Coolin, Maida, Bum, and Toby)
14. A picture of you with the piper(s) in the Royal Mile
15. A picture of as many types of Scotch whisky in one picture as possible

## Liverpool

- 1) Take as many photos of the Liverbird symbol as possible (anywhere)
- 2) Visit or take photos in front of:
  - the Royal Albert Dock
  - Visit the Maritime Museum
  - Visit the Tate Gallery
  - RMS Lusitania Propeller
  - Pilotage Building
  - Walker Art Gallery
  - Museum of Liverpool
  - The Beatles Museum
  - The Beatles statue
  - The Cavern Club (+ Penny Lane or Strawberry Fields)
  - Liverpool Cathedral
  - Everyman Theatre
  - Saint James Mount and Gardens
  - Chinatown
- 3) Find the Robin Hood's Stone, take your photo in front of it and explain its legend.
- 4) Crack the Liverpool Central Library Entrance Riddle.
- 5) Eat a typical Liverpool food (e.g. Scouse) or famous streetfood. Take your photo while eating it.
- 6) Find something related to cinematography, e.g. a famous shooting place or th place linked to any actor/actress.
- 7) Find and take your photo in front of any tourist curiosity in Liverpool, e.g. Superlambanana or Penelope.
- 8) Do anything related to FC Liverpool (visit its fan shop, wear its logo, visit the match, etc.)
- 9) Shoot anything funny or bizarre in Liverpool.

## Gibraltar

1. Visit the most southerly point of Gibraltar's peninsula = the Europa Point.
2. Tour the Rock and make photos with monkeys.
3. Dolphin watching
4. Ride the Gibraltar Cable Car.
5. Visit one of or all of these places: the Trinity Lighthouse, the old chapel of Nuestra Señora de Europa, and the Mosque of The Custodian of the Holy Mosques.
6. See the Harding Battery with the Nun's Well.
7. Take a photo of the Sikorski Memorial and explain its meaning.
8. Visit the St. Michael's Cave
9. The Forbes' Quarry,
10. the Heritage Centre at Princess Caroline's Battery

11. the O'Hara's Battery
12. the Skywalk
13. the Windsor Suspension Bridge
14. the Great Siege Tunnels of Gibraltar
15. Anything related to James Bond's Ian Flemming
